Answers

1. Babies that are placed for adoption are unwanted and unloved.

False

While the pregnancy is unplanned, the decision to place a baby for adoption is made out of love and concern for the baby. Choosing to give a baby life and a chance at a better childhood through adoption is a loving choice made in the best interest of the child. Many birth parents desire to raise their baby, but know that they are not in a position to provide what their child needs.

A birth mother never forgets about the baby she placed for adoption. Aborting a baby and placing a baby for adoption are both difficult and painful choices. Both are choices that a birth parent must live with for the rest of his or her life. With adoption, the birth parents can take comfort in the gift of life and love they gave their child and the adoptive parents. With adoption, the birth parent also has the opportunity to know the child.

4. Adopted children grow up knowing nothing about their birth parents.

Open Adoption allows the birth parents and the adoptive parents to meet and get to know each another. Adoptive parents then can help the child know about his or her birth parents. In Open Adoptions with ongoing contact between the child and the birth parents, the adopted child has firsthand knowledge of his or her birth parents.
